

## William Ward to John Henry Eaton

Choctaw Nation  
Apl 19th. 1830.

Sir

Inclosed are two Letters forwarded to me in haste from a Numerous Council of two Districts of the Choctaws in which they disclaim the appontment of Colo. Greenwood Lafloore as Chief of the whole Nation. But have made other appointments for their Districts (viz) Mushulatubbee as Chief to the N. East District and Nittukaichee as Chief to the Southern District. They are willing to receive propositions and Conclude a Treaty for their Lands in Mississippi But protest against those proposed by the Lafloore & the Folsom parties, already forwarded to the Government. I shall apprise the Governor of this State by the Next Mail of the contents of those Letters &c. as it is conseived that the Choctaws are under the protection of the State Government. By the next Mail I shall apprise you of the further proceedings of the Council. I have the Honor to be Yr Most Obdt Servt
