Council Ground. April 17. 1830.

Friend and Brother,

We the undersigned Chiefs and headme[n] of the N. E. District and the Southern District have been informed from undoubted Source that Col Leflore and Folsom have been busily engaged in stiring the hearts of the people to Mutiny, and it is fast drawing to a close head, and the consequence must be desasterous. They threaten to come upon us with an armd force of a thousand men that if we do not acceed to their nefarious plans. We look up to our white breathern for protiction, we therefore urge you forthwith to use your utmost powers to prevent blood shed among us and to restore order and tranquility in the nation. There must be no time lost in this business. We are Respectfully Your friends and brothers.
