I should you be instructed to furnish
them with every thing necessary to move.

He would like to start by the 1st of
October. I should these people go

I should like to go as an Interpreter;

And I wish you to write to the Secretary
of war for the appointment, for me.

It is the wish of Zappunahoonah that
John Band should go as their leader
