

Washington June 14th 1830

Friend

We intend sitting out for Tennessee on the 17th instant. My stay in Tennessee cannot be long, but will be happy to see you if your own convenience will permit you to come to Nashville whilst I am in its neighborhood & visit one of the Hermitage. The chertow chiefs, Thro their agent sent have, have requested that I should meet them near Nashville, to which I have answered, that upon their principle chiefs of the whole nation uniting in that request, I would comply with their wishes. This my principle business, still my desire is once more to visit the Hermitage & if possible once more see you.

At the Congress has acted very strangely & contrary in most things to what is expected, still my administration is going on pretty well - but still there has been, & are things that have annoyed my peace, & my mind, & must more or less my administration will be a disheartened one, - which I cannot permit. I wish to see you, will be at the Hermitage early in July with my love to your family & the donations of all here, I am sincerely your friend.
