Genl Daniel S. Donelson goes on
to Washington in company with
W. W. Lamore. I have requested Whelst
in the city that they make out their
their house - you will therefore
cause the servants, ^{stewards}, to attend
& provide for them. I request
that you will kindly attend to them
to the Genl & Mr.

I refer you for the news of this
Mr Lamore for the news of this
country. I am on my way to
Franklin to arrange matters
for a meeting with the choctaws
cheep who I expect in shortly, if
they come to meet me this day
their general council on the

motion is to be held, & our agent
is there awaiting their final an-
swers. Should they conclude not to
come in & meet me, I shall set out
in a few days on my return to
the city. so soon as I am advised
of the result of the council I will
write you

Present me to all the heads
of Departments, Bureaus with
their families. say to Kendall
that his reply to King has given
satisfaction to all, that he was
rightfully removed.
