

Andrew Jackson to William Berkeley Lewis

Nashville August 10th 1830—

Dr. Major

Genl Daniel S. Donelson goes on to Washington in company with Mr. Mc.Lamore. I have requested whilst in the city that they make our House their home—you will therefore cause the servants, & steward, to attend & provide for them. I request that you will kindly attend to them

I refer you to the Genl & Mr. McLamore for the news of this country. I am on my way to Franklin to arrange matters for a meeting with the choctaw chiefs who I expect in shortly, if *they come to meet me*—This day their general council in the nation is to be held, & our agent is there awaiting their final answer. Should they conclude not to come in & meet me, I shall set out in a few days on my return to the city. so soon as I am advised of the result of the council I will write you.

Present me to all the heads of Departments, & Bureaus with their families—say to Kendal that his reply to King has given satisfaction to all, that he was rightfully removed, respectfully yr. friend
