Friend & Brother, This day we held a council
at the house of Mushulatubbee, the communi-
-cation from the Boys was interpreted & explained
we were all very
~~all the head men~~ much pleased to hear it,
the time is drawing near when congress will
meet, we request you as a friend & brother
to do all you can for us & our Nation,
this day most of all. The leading men in
our District were present as also the
head men of the council has in council
assembled with one accord agreed to reinstate
Mushulatubbee in the office of Chief and gave good and
sufficient reasons for so doing, the Mission-
-aries who reside in the Nation have received
our money for about eleven years and
have rendered no services to our people.
neither in point of civilization or education
we are all for having the missionaries moved
out of the Nation if it could be done by
government.
