Sir

Enclosed are two Letters
forwarded to me in haste from a Numerous
Council of two Districts of the Cherokees
in which they disclaim the appointment of
Col. Greenwood Leflore as Chief of the whole
Nation. But have made other appointments
for their Districts (viz) Mispahlabbe as Chief
to the N. East District and Attukachee as Chief
to the Southern District. They are willing to receive
proposition, and conclude a Treaty for their Land
in Mississippi But protest against those proposed
by the Leflore & the Folsom parties already forwarded
to the Government. I shall apprise the Governor
of this State by the Next Mail of the contents
of those Letters &c. as it is confessed that the Cherokees
are under the protection of the State Government.
By the next Mail I shall apprise you of the further
